"I'd usually have a few choice words for the receiver and tell him he better tell his coaches not to throw over here again," said the talented corner back with a laugh. "I don't play that."

Cyphers helped Oaks Christian to an 8-3 record last season and in the process earn valuable experience on how to play through adversity. He hopes to use this newfound knowledge to benefit the team in 2013.

"I have to let the younger guys know about the winning tradition here at Oaks Christian and what it's like to be around great players like Ishmael Adams (UCLA), Jordan Payton (UCLA) and all the great players that have come through here," he explained. "We have to teach these younger guys that you have to come in and work hard. If you do that, everything's going to pay off for us."

"That's what we do at Oaks Christian. We work hard, lift, run and we put in the extra effort to be able to go out there and get the win."

Those are some impressive schools and he's definitely interested in all of them, but there's one particular program that highly intrigues the dynamic junior.

"I've been looking into Notre Dame a lot and not just for football, but because they have high academics," he admitted. "That's what's going to be most important for me in the future because I know football's not always going to be there forever. When I make my decision it will not just be based on sports, but mostly on academics. Notre Dame is very high up there and I see it being a good fit for me academically.
