“I have a slight tear of my PCL and meniscus, and I have a bone contusion as well. This has caused a double amount of fluid in my right knee than normal, so they have to get that fluid out. They tell me something’s still aggravated in there and that’s why there’s so much fluid. The plan is to get all the fluid out and start working on my quad strength again.”

The talented Illinois lineman took some time out of his rehabilitation schedule to travel up to South Bend this past weekend for Notre Dame’s end of the season banquet and thought the whole thing was very impressive.

“The way they set it up this year, like a professional award show you’d see on ESPN, was pretty creative and I think it flowed pretty well,” he shared. “It really was a great way to spend my Friday night at Notre Dame and see all the great players honored.”
